THOUGHTS ON THE GOSPEL

For the 4th Sunday after Epiphany - JANUARY 28, 2018


"Just then there was in their synagogue a man with an unclean spirit..." (Mark 1:23). Jesus has just been teaching in the synagogue in Capernaum, a village by the Sea of Galilee, when this individual appears who has apparently lost his mind. Mark's way of putting it is that "he has an unclean spirit." That's the same language used to describe lepers. They are considered unclean.

On a day to day basis most of us take our sanity for granted. And not only ours but the people around us. But lately it's become more and more obvious to me that many people are struggling with various forms of debilitating mental conditions, their own or their loved ones. A friend I used to play golf with has "frontal temporal lobe dementia." That unclean spirit has robbed him of his ability to make good judgments. A colleague once told me that he mistakenly took his wife's medication and it threw him into a medically induced bi-polar disorder that lasted for years, and nearly cost him his marriage and his ministry. Thankfully it is under control now. Friends and loved ones suffering from Alzheimer's have their memories slowly erased until they are hardly able to function or recognize their families. Addictions take their toll on our families and friends.

It's been said, "We all have our demons." The unclean spirit that was afflicting the man in this Sunday's Gospel from Mark 1, obviously caused him to not be himself. His illness was deeply disturbing to the

congregation that gathered on that Sabbath to hear the young rabbi from Nazareth who "taught with authority," and had command of the unclean spirits, and indeed to the whole community. It is indeed good news for us to know that the one who came to live and to die for God's people, who brought the good news of God's Kingdom, brought that good news personally to a person so afflicted, bringing healing.

For the many who have experienced the struggles and sorrows of mental illness and addictions, it is good news indeed that in the kingdom coming, such things will be no more. As Jesus proclaims in The Revelation "The former things have passed away. Behold I make all things new."

Spiritual Direction

The art of Christian conversation and listening carried out in the context of a trusting relationship.

What is Spiritual Direction?

It is an interpersonal relationship where someone encourages you to

reflect on your life in the light of the Gospel and Christian wisdom. Through this process, you are led and encouraged to discover a more conscious experience of God's presence and love.

Spiritual direction should not be confused with counseling or psychotherapy. While spiritual direction often includes issues with which you are struggling, the emphasis is of your faith journey. Spiritual direction is about growing in faith rather than solving problems.

Is Spiritual Direction for Me?

Not everyone is in need of spiritual direction in every phase of life. You might come to spiritual direction for a variety of reasons, including:

- identify and trust your own experience of God
- integrate spirituality into your daily life
- discern and make choices
- share hopes, fears, struggles, and losses
- develop a sensitivity for justice and concern for the poor and marginalized
- live the essence of your faith with integrity
- notice the Holy Spirit's voice and movement in your life

What Is the Role of a Spiritual Director?

The privilege and responsibility of a spiritual director is to accompany you as you deepen your relationship with God. This relationship takes place in the context of confidential one-on-one meetings (usually once a month) with a spiritual director, who listens, encourages, challenges, and prays with you — who freely shares the movement of the Holy Spirit in your life.

A spiritual director can help you express your struggles, pain, joys, and gratitudes, and to share these with God; to notice God's presence in your life and prayers; to savor, re-live, and respond to your experience of God; and to notice interior changes and the effects these changes have on your relationships and life. God is always your primary spiritual director.

You can end direction at any time. There is no charge for spiritual direction.

If you are interested, I would be happy to speak with you about spiritual direction and/or make an initial appointment. You can contact me through the church office (503-843-4747) or we can talk before/or after Divine Service on a Sunday. I received my training and certification as a Spiritual Director from the Shalom Prayer Center in Mt. Angel.

Companions in Christ equips Christian Caregivers/ Companions to support others in times of need. A Caregiver/Companion is trained and supervised for private, confidential, personal Christian caring to people in our congregation and community experiencing challenges in their lives. A Caregiver/Companion is not a counselor or therapist; a Caregiver/Companion is a coach and mentor.

Caregivers/Companions. . .

Engage simple presence and empathic listening Respond to their baptismal call to be Christ to others

Walk beside the person who is hurting and broken

Care, pray (if appropriate), support, encourage, suggest

Do not make decisions or tell people what to do

Caregivers/Companions. . .

Support others experiencing grief, sadness, loneliness and discouragement, chronic illness and disability, spiritual crisis, terminal illness, aging issues and other life challenges.

The choice of meeting with a Caregiver/Companions is up to the person being referred (the person must consent). After the initial visit, the person is not obliged to continue and visits can end at any time. Each visit is approximately one hour and the conversations are absolutely confidential. There is no cost for this ministry.

Both services continue on the **2**nd and **4**th **Wednesdays of each month at the 2:00PM and 3:00PM times**.

Our Christian Fellowship gatherings offer a mixture of a couple of well-known songs/hymns, Holy Communion, Bible readings/stories which have meaning for our daily lives, an opportunity to share about faith, prayers, and talking about difficulties of living someplace other than home and meeting the challenges. FROM THE HYMNAL

Then He said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field."

~Matthew 9:37 - 38

Mission work is an important function in our churches, whether it be at the far reaches of the globe or with the neighbor next door. We hear very little about local mission efforts, especially in the era when this hymn was written. Many missionary sermons are preached from the pulpit but it isn't often we sing such a beautifully worded and challenging missionary hymn as this one, which was spontaneously written by Reginald Heber.

Heber was born in 1783 into a wealthy, educated family. He was well educated, entering Oxford at the age of 17 and winning 2 awards for his poetry during his time there. After graduation, he became rector of his father's church in the west of England where he remained for 16 years. In 1823, he was appointed Bishop of Calcutta (India) and worked tirelessly for 3 years until weather and travel took its toll on his health and he died of a stroke.

In the summer of 1819, Heber was asked by his father-in-law if he knew a worthy hymn that could be used at a missionary service the following Sunday. Heber went at once to his study for a few minutes and soon returned with the first stanzas. His family was very pleased, however he felt the hymn was still incomplete, returned to his study and completed the triumphant final verse.

Five years later the tune was composed specifically for Heber's text by the noted American educator and church musician, Lowell Mason. It is said that Mason composed this tune with a great sense of inspiration.

From Greenland's icy mountains, from India's coral strand, where Afric's sunny fountains roll down their golden sand, from many an ancient river, from many a palmy plain, they call us to deliver their land from error's chain.

Shall we, whose souls are lighted with wisdom from on high, shall we to men benighted the lamp of life deny? Salvation! O salvation! The joyful sound proclaim, till earth's remotest nation has learned Messiah's name.

Waft, waft, ye winds, His story, and you, ye waters, roll, till like a sea of glory it spreads from pole to pole, till o'er our ransomed nature the Lamb for sinners slain, Redeemer, King, Creator, in bliss return to reign!

Jan. 24, 2018 Dear Friends,

Just wanted to bring you up to date on the plans for next summer. Lani and I will be returning to Anchorage on April 25th and then to Copper Center on the 26th. We have been in



contact with ones from Copper Center to keep abreast of how they are doing. At the last contact there was about 3 feet of snow on the ground with more expected tonight. Temps have been about seasonal with a couple of weeks of -30 and more recently between -20 & +10. Craig has been contacting companies about the final supplies to finish the parsonage project. Thus far a couple of folks have expressed the desire to come up and help but no settled plans. There are no work teams scheduled since the project consists of small rooms to frame, dry wall and paint along with floor covering and a small amount of electrical and plumbing. Not room for many people to work at one time. If someone or a couple is interested in coming for a short while to help, let us know.

The congregations at Chistochina and Mendeltna have asked that Craig bring messages from God's Word again this summer. We arrive on Thursday the 26th and he begins at Chistochina on the 29th and will again alternate between the two groups through mid Sept. This keeps him busy and out of most mischief. He has been working on those messages all winter as there is little preparation time during the summer with working on the parsonage daily.

We are still awaiting the scheduling for Lani's foot surgery, one that supposed to happen over a year ago but delayed due to the heart issues. Otherwise both of us are doing well.

Again we thank you for your interest in this ministry over the years. In closing, please pray for the surgery to take place soon so Lani can be healed for the summer's ministry. Also pray for the ministry, that the project can be completed and the parsonage ready for occupancy, that we can have many opportunities to be a blessing as we share spiritual truths with those folks and that the Lord would provide just the right couple to come and minister full time to the precious folks in Copper Center.

Maple Syrup

Did you know you can make maple syrup from our native Bigleaf Maples? Well you can! Hagglund's have been experimenting with some of their maple trees. It takes about

40 gallons of sap to boil down to 1 gallon of syrup. Hal boils the sap outdoors over a wood fire all day; then when the sap is getting close to syrup, we complete the boiling indoors. Our first batch produced almost nothing, the next batch about 1 pint of syrup, then we've had a couple more times when the sap was running better so that was encouraging. It tastes great!

The rental building is pretty well empty now but of course will need cleaning. No date yet for when we can open for visitors.




