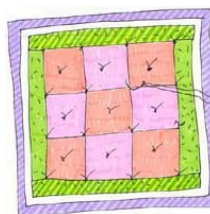

We will be selling hand dipped corn dogs and snow cones in front of First Federal Savings and Loan on Saturday, June 16<sup>th</sup>.

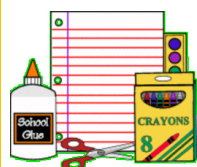

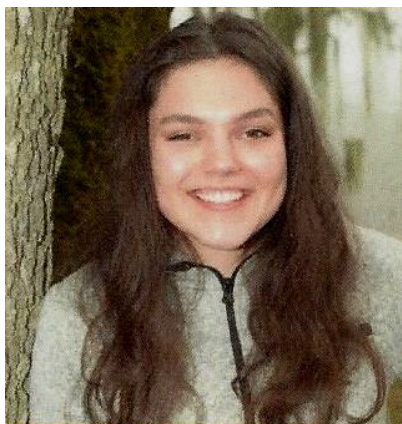

I apologize for taking so long to send out an update again. I just finished my sophomore year of college!!! It was a challenging, but fun spring semester. Here are the classes I took:

**Judaism, the Other, and the State: Encounters in Modern Jewish Thought** - This class was extremely thought-provoking. We read a wide variety of thinkers

including, Martin Buber, Baruch Spinoza, Immanuel Kant, Barbara Myerhoff, Judith Plaskow, Abraham Joshua Heschel, Moses Mendelssohn, and a lot of others. :) Class discussions were always really interesting. We had three paper assignments. My final paper focused on the issues of authenticity, experience and cognitive ability when thinking about the works of Nietzsche, Kierkegaard, Buber and Myerhoff.

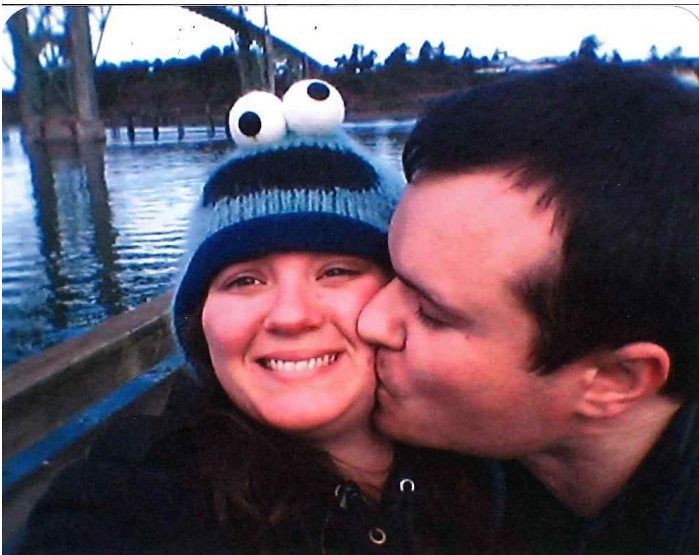
### The New Promised Land? Judaism in the United States, 1600-Present --

Another Jewish Studies class! :) I loved this class. It was mainly lecture-based, with readings to help add background and depth. We went on two "field trips" to two different synagogues. One, a Reform synagogue, in Richmond. The church that I sometimes attend with one of my square-dance grandmothers is located right by this synagogue, and we hadn't ever realized it! We went during the week, not during services so we could have a more casual introduction to the space. The other synagogue we went to (Beth Abraham, I think), was a Conservative synagogue. We went at the time of the service, which was really interesting. Everyone was very welcoming and excited to see us.

**Reading and Writing Poetry** - I took a class from this professor last fall (literature and identity). Poetry is not my favorite genre, but I really liked the materials we used in this class. I produced a lot of poetry, some of which I am really excited about. As a final, I had to put together a poetry portfolio with an introduction to the work, and why I

chose the pieces I did. I included poems that I thought were the most honest. The challenges this class presented were less about the amount of reading/writing, and more about content and form of my work.

**Introduction to Quaker History** -The professor is Thomas Hamm, and he is a prominent historian in the field of Quakerism. I took a class with him on Tudor Stuart England, and really enjoyed it, so I decided to take another class with him. I really loved learning more about Quakerism, especially because of Earlham's involvement with it. It was mainly a lecture-based course, with background readings along the way. My final paper focused on the relationship between Quakers and Native Americans during the 17<sup>th</sup>, 18<sup>th</sup>, and 19<sup>th</sup> centuries.

**Yoga** -- I took yoga again, and really enjoyed it!

### Other news. . .

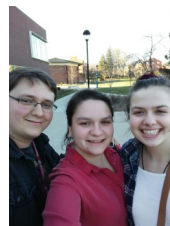

After a lot of research, I decided to costume the witches in a more gothic/nature-based style, while the other characters stayed within mainstream 1982/1983 clothing. My favorite piece to make was feather covered shoulder pauldrons for one of the witches. During April, for Earlham's EPIC expo (two days of presenting work, research, etc.), I set up a display of my design process. In addition to that show, I sewed costumes for a production of *The Importance of Being Earnest*.

**FROM THE HYMNAL  
COME THOU ALMIGHTY KING  
Anonymous 1757**

**Italian Hymn Tune – Felice de Giardini  
1716-1796**

One must reflect again on the importance of having a proper perspective regarding the Godhead. What are the dangers of giving less than full and equal recognition of deity to each member of the Trinity?

In his book, *The Knowledge of the Holy*, A.W. Tozer left these choice words regarding the Trinity:

*The doctrine of the Trinity...is truth for the heart. The fact that it cannot be satisfactorily explained, instead of being against it, is in its favor. Such a truth had to be revealed; no one could have imagined it.*

The doctrine of the Trinity has been controversial since the earliest days of Christianity. In A.D. 325, the Council of Nicaea affirmed its belief in the triune Godhead. During the 16<sup>th</sup> century Reformation period, it was again denied by the Socinians. And still today many liberal theologians and groups are blatant in their denial. They often speak of God, the Father of all, Jesus, the mere man, and the divine influence of the Spirit of God. This form of blasphemy relegates each member of the Godhead to a role far less than that ascribed in the Bible.

This familiar Trinity hymn is also one of our most popular “opening hymns” (or used to be) for a Sunday morning worship service. It appeared anonymously in England in about 1757 to commemorate Trinity Sunday. It has been attributed by some to Charles Wesley since it first appeared in a pamphlet published by John Wesley.

This is a hymn that must always be sung with all four stanzas. To omit any of the first three would be to slight one of the members of the Godhead. The fourth stanza is a grand affirmation of the mysterious doctrine of the Trinity, that God is One yet Three and ever worthy of our love and adoration.

*Come, Thou Almighty King, help us Thy name to sing,  
help us to praise: Father, all glorious, o’er all victorious,  
come and reign over us, Ancient of Days*

*Come, Thou Incarnate Word, gird on Thy mighty sword,  
our prayer attend; come and Thy people bless, and give  
Thy word success – Spirit of holiness, on us descend.*

*Come, Holy Comforter, Thy sacred witness bear in this  
glad hour; Thou who almighty art, now rule in ev’ry  
heart, and ne’er from us depart, Spirit of pow’r.*

Percy had met his relatives only a couple of times in his life and is not happy with his parents for this punishment. He meets a peculiar lass named Gwyneth whom the towns-people avoid if they can. Many are unkind to her and gossip about her as she passes. Percy’s cousin Florilyn does her best to make him go back home where he belongs. Somehow, he wins her heart and they become the best of friends.

The death of Percy’s Uncle and his deathbed promise add a little mystery to our story. Percy is to find the missing heir to the country estate of Westbrook. His older cousin Courtenay is making his own plans for the estate as soon as he is of age.

I loved the language in the book. It reminded me of Grandpa. His accent was thick, and at times, I had trouble understanding him when I was young. I wish that I could go back in time and have a visit again. I will have to wait until I’m on the other side for that. I imagined him in the pages of the book as I read. It had a happy ending that you will enjoy.

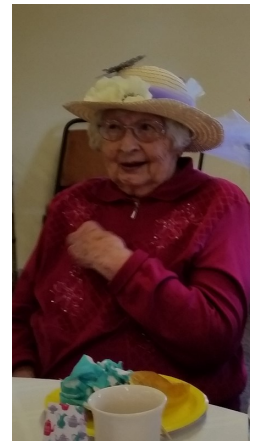
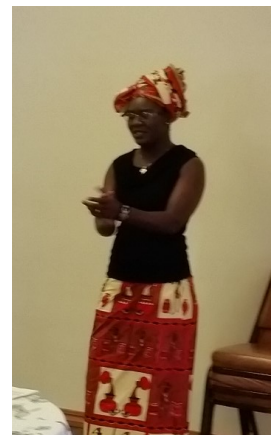
# Ladies Tea Review!
