A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Trinity members and friends,

While not everyone could be at the **Installation Service** on May 21, I want to thank all those who included our installation service in their Sunday afternoon that day. The Installation of a Pastor, whether settled or intentional interim, is an important public recognition that the pastor didn't just walk in off the street or show up one Sunday. Rather he has been "**rightly called**" to a congregation to preach and teach the Gospel of our Lord.

I am grateful for this call among you and thankful to our elders, church council, and all the volunteers who made it such a marvelous celebration marking the beginning of our ministry together. Special thanks and appreciation go to all those who prepared and served and helped clean up after the wonderful dinner we had afterward. I want to thank the choir and our musicians for their wonderful music, and I want to thank my colleagues in the Holy Ministry for taking the time to gather with us and support us in their prayers and good words. God has truly blessed Trinity with a beautiful place to worship and wonderful people who strive to make our worship a worthy offering of praise and thanksgiving to God.

My thanks to Pastor Michael Warmbier for serving as President Paul Linnemann's representative and officiating at the installation rite. I also want thank my friend, Pastor Paul Doellinger who preached such a great sermon for us.

It was wonderful to have a good group of people from my former congregation, Shepherd of the Valley in Corvallis with us. I thank them for their support and friendship.

And I want to thank my wife, Pastor Patricia, for coming to share in the installation service. Patricia is currently serving at Holy Cross Lutheran Church in Salem, a congregation of the Oregon Synod, ELCA. While we two are not in the same Lutheran denominational family, she has been an incredible support to me in my work as an intentional interim pastor. She earned board certification in her work as chaplain at Sacred Heart Hospital in Springfield, Oregon. You may remember it was at a training event for interim ministry that we first met at Concordia Seminary in St. Louis in 2011. In 2013 God led us to marry and share the joy He provides for these later years of our lives as husband and wife.

Looking ahead, June means that summer is really here! Our church changes worship times during the summer as you know. Worship begins at 10:00 AM starting May 28^{th} , the Memorial Day weekend. That next week Patricia and I will be heading south to California for a continuing education seminar in interim ministry in Santa Anna. Pastor Gene Ludwig has agreed to be on call for Trinity while I am away should there be a pastor care need.

June also marks the end of the Easter Season (seven weeks long) and beginning of the Season of Pentecost. June 4 is **Pentecost Sunday** and everyone is invited to wear red to celebrate the out pouring of the Holy Spirit and the birthday of the church. June 11 is Trinity Sunday, our last "white Sunday" for quite a while. **Trinity Sunday**, or the Feast of the Holy Trinity, is the only Sunday in the church year that commemorates not an event (like Christmas or Easter), but a reality: that God has revealed Himself

to us and invites us to know Him as Father, Son and Holy Spirit, three in one. Trinity Sunday celebrates the truth, unique to the Christian faith: God made us and all that is, God's saves us in Jesus, the Son, and God is with us, now and into all eternity in the Holy Spirit!

I look forward to continuing to get to know each and every one of you and the Sheridan community. I am still very much the "new guy" who still hasn't even begun to match names and faces. So you could help me by not hesitating to remind me of your name, the way Mrs. Elias does when she greets me after worship. I'd like very much to visit with you face to face some time soon. If you'd like to set up a time right away, don't hesitate to give me a call on my cell phone.

Ladies Aid

(Lutheran Women's Missionary League, LWML)

Ladies Aid will meet on Tuesday, June 6 at 1 pm in the Fellowship Hall

If you were to attend one of our Ladies Aid meetings you would see on the table two empty, plastic margarine tubs. Nothing fancy here. One is labeled "Offerings" the other is labeled "Mites". So what exactly are mites and offerings? Stefanie Morrow, our treasurer, gave us a wonderful report.

Offerings are collected and used at Trinity by the Ladies Aid in whatever capacity we deem necessary. We support missionaries Craig and Lani Norwood and Love's Door.

Based on the Biblical account of the widow's mites are collected and used to fund many programs at the district and national level. 25% of the mites are given to the national LWML organization. National mites fund over \$1 million in mission grants. A few of the programs that are funded include: LCMS Disaster Response Trailers; Cancer Care Packages; Bringing the Gospel to the Lost Sheep of Israel and Lutheran Young Adult Corps. The other 75% of the mites collected are used by the Oregon District to fund programs they have chosen: a soccer clinic for underprivileged youth in Portland; a Lutheran church in Belize, the very first LCMS church there; help for families facing a life threatening illness; scholarships for pastoral education for African students are just a few receiving our mites.

From time to time you will see a very large "Mite Box" on the table in the narthex along with a little information on each of the programs that benefit from them. Please join us in reaching out to others with the Good News of Jesus Christ one coin at a time. Together we are making a difference.



SPIRITUAL DIRECTION OPPORTUNITY

Spiritual Direction is a ministry of directing thoughts and movements of our hearts toward God and responding to the presence of God in our lives. It is a conversation among three persons: the Director/Guide; the Directee; and the Holy Spirit which occurs on Holy Ground. The Director/Guide helps another person hear, see, and respond to God.

A Director/Guide offers companionship to help make sense of the faith journey by guidance in interpreting the significant markers on the journey and supporting transitions of the pilgrimage. Together, we foster development of your interior life through prayer. In maturing presence and sacred listening, we will have the opportunity to explore your sacred journey and relationship with God. We spend a portion of our time together in prayer and *Lectio divina*.

Your decision to meet is the result of your desire to examine your spiritual life. My role is not to be a psychotherapist, but it is at times appropriate for us to discuss psychological and relational challenges in the context of spiritual direction. I do not give advice, but assist in providing direction for personal spiritual growth and decision making.

Our private meetings our strictly confidential and would occur for approximately one hour a month at a mutually agreeable time. You can end direction at any time. There is no charge for Spiritual Direction.





Food Bank

Thanks to the generosity of our supporters - residents and businesses in Sheridan and Willamina areas - your local food bank has been able to accomplish some important activities since the beginning of 2017.

First, in the period from Jan. - Apr. we have been able to provide emergency food boxes to more than 800 individuals. The boxes include a variety of food - from fresh eggs and milk, produce, meat, canned food, salads and frozen veggies. We also make sure everyone gets a jar of peanut butter and a box of cereal.

Second, we have been able to purchase a used refrigerator-freezer from the McMinnville Senior Center and a new commercial refrigerator. We received grants from several organizations that covered nearly all the cost of these two items.

Third, thanks to generous cash donations we have been able to purchase two new carts that we use to load food boxes for our clients. We have also purchased a commercial grade unloading device that allows us to move pallets of food into the warehouse.

Fourth, we have installed a new sink in the food distribution area and currently are working to upgrade our gas heating system.

Fifth, we have acquired a used 2001 box truck to pick up our food from the McMinnville food bank and other locations.

Our volunteers have donated many extra hours over the past four months to reorganize the distribution area to accommodate the large commercial refrigerator.

We have been truly blessed - thanks to your generous donations of cash, food, and time. If you would like to tour the food bank or if you have any questions about its operations please call me at 503-843-4353.

FROM THE HYMNAL



CROWN HIM WITH MANY CROWNS

Matthew Bridges 1800-1894 Godfrey Thring 1823-1903

Christ who bore the crown of thorns while on the cross is now crowned with "many crowns" as the reigning monarch in heaven. Each crown in this hymn text exalts Christ for some specific aspect of His person or ministry: Stanza 1 Crown Him with many crowns – for His eternal Kingship, Stanza 2 Crown Him the Lord of love — for his love demonstrated in redemptive suffering, Stanza 3 Crown Him the Lord of life — for His victorious resurrection and ascension, Stanza 4 Crown Him the Lord of heaven — as a member of the Triune Godhead ever worthy of worship and praise.

The above 4 stanza text is the combined effort of two distinguished Anglican clergyman, each of whom desired to write a hymn of exaltation to our suffering

but now victorious Lord. The version by Matthew Bridges first appeared in 1851 with 6 stanzas. 23 years later Godfrey Thring wrote 6 additional stanzas. The above form of the hymn includes stanzas 1, 2, and 4 by Bridges and the 3rd stanza by Thring. Many of you may recognize other familiar stanzas depending on which hymnal this hymn is

found. The red service book which was a hymnal published by Augsburg Publishing House for the Lutheran Church in America has 5 stanzas, two of which are not included in the above, *Crown Him the Lord of peace...* and *Crown Him the Lord of years...* The author of these verses would require additional research to see if they belong to Bridges or Thring.

The tune, *Diademata* (the Greek word for 'crowns') was composed especially for this text by George Elvey, a noted organist at St George's Chapel in Windsor, England, where British royalty attend Easter Sunday service and royal occasions.

Servant Sundays





1 t. Vanilla


Sift together:
