Dear members and friends of Trinity, Sheridan:

I hope and pray these "lazy, hazy, crazy days of summer" find you and yours well, and having many opportunities to enjoy the sun and the warm weather.

Christ Offers Forgiveness For Everyone Everywhere



FROM THE HYMNAL

IT IS WELL WITH MY SOUL Horatio G Spafford 1828 - 1888

Inner peace through an implicit trust in the love of God is the real evidence of a mature Christian faith. Only with this kind of faith could Horatio G Spafford

experience such personal tragedies as he did and yet be able to say, "It is well with my soul."

Spafford was a successful attorney in Chicago. He was the father of 4 daughters, an active member of the Presbyterian church, and a loyal friend and supporter of D.L. Moody and other evangelical leaders of his day. Then, a series of calamities began, starting with the great Chicago fire of 1871 which wiped out the families extensive real estate investments.

It was 2 years later that Spafford decided to take his family on vacation in Europe. In November, 1873, Spafford was detained by urgent business, but sent his wife and daughters as scheduled on the *S.S. Ville du Harve*, planning to join them soon. Halfway across the Atlantic, the ship was struck by an English vessel and sank within 12 minutes. All four of the Spafford daughters were among the 226 who drowned. Mrs. Spafford was among the few who were miraculously saved.

Horatio Spafford stood hour after hour on the deck of the ship carrying him to rejoin his grieving wife in Cardiff, Wales. When the ship passed the approximate place where his daughters had drowned, Spafford received sustaining comfort from God that enabled him to write, "When sorrows like sea billows roll....It is well with my soul." What a picture of hope!

> When peace, like a river, attendeth my way, when sorrows like seabillows roll-Whatever my lot, Thou hast taught me to say, It is well, it is well with my soul.

Tho Satan should buffet, tho trials should come, let this blest assurance control, That Christ hath regarded my helpless estate, and hath shed His blood for my soul.

And, Lord, haste the day when my faith shall be sight, the clouds be rolled back as a scroll, The trump will resound and the Lord shall descend, "Even so" – it is well with my soul.

POTATO CASSEROLE

This potato dish was served at Pastor Joe's Installation luncheon. There are a couple of similar recipes in the Trinity cookbook.

- 1 pkg. (32 oz.) frozen hash brown potatoes
- 1 (10¾ oz.) can cream of mushroom, chicken or celery soup
- 12 oz. grated cheddar cheese
- 1 (8 oz.) carton sour cream or buttermilk
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1/2 small onion, chopped
- 2 c. crushed corn flakes
- 1/2 c. melted butter

Place thawed potatoes in baking dish. Mix together next 6 ingredients and pour over potatoes. Top with crushed corn flakes. Drizzle melted butter over all. Recipe is good without the butter.

Bake uncovered at 350° for 45 minutes.
