From Our Pastor:



Dear friends in Christ:

I was invited to share a few words with you in this edition of the Trinity newsletter. **The first thing I want to say is "thank you!"** I thank God and I thank you for the opportunity to come and serve our risen Lord with you. As noted in the letter included in this edition of your newsletter (on pg. 2) my first Sunday with you will be on May 14. Please keep me and my wife, Patricia, in your prayers as I bid farewell and Godspeed to the people of God at Shepherd of the Valley in Corvallis and begin a new ministry with you at Trinity in Sheridan. I have much to learn and I ask your prayers and patience with me.

Prior to serving at Shepherd of the Valley in Corvallis I served intentional interim ministries at St. John in Hemet, California, Trinity in Salina, Kansas, and St. Paul in Sadorus, Illinois. Each congregation I have served has presented both joys and challenges. I am grateful for both. The joys are God's good and gracious gifts to us, without any merit or worthiness in us, as we say in the Small Catechism. The challenges present opportunities to grow deeper in faith and understanding of Christian leadership and care in the local congregation.

I was born and raised in New Orleans, Louisiana. I was baptized and confirmed at First English Lutheran Church there where my parents were members. My mother came to the Lutheran Church from the Catholic Church when she married dad. They provided for my instruction in the Christian faith not only by bringing me to worship, sending me to Sunday School and Confirmation class, but also by enrolling me in day school at St. Paul First English Lutheran School where I attended through the 9th grade. During my teens I was part of Walther League and credit my experience there with leading me to believe that God was calling me to be a pastor in His church.

I attended the University of New Orleans and Concordia Senior College, and then continued my education at Concordia Seminary in Exile (Seminex) for two years. I transferred to the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago where I earned the Master of Divinity (1979) and Doctor of Ministry (2005) and was ordained into the Lutheran Church in America (LCA) in 1979. In 2007 I returned to my roots in the LC-MS, applying for and being approved for the ordained roster in the LC-MS by colloquy. The congregation I served provided for my training and credentialing in Interim Ministry. I am a member of the Interim Ministry Forum of the LC-MS, and attend continuing education events to keep my credentialing current. My wife, Patricia, and I have been married for four years. We have four adult children; my son and daughter live with their spouses in Chicago. Patricia's son lives in Vancouver, WA and her daughter lives with her husband in Austin TX. And we have three grandchildren. Patricia is a Board Certified Chaplain and currently serves Holy Cross Lutheran Church (ELCA) in Salem. I look forward to the opportunity to get to know you and to share the good news of God's love in Christ with all of you and the Sheridan community.

Dwelling in the Word Adult Education Forum

"Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path." Psalm 119: 105

After Easter, we began a study of The Epistle of James. The consensus of scholars concludes the Epistle was written by the brother of Jesus who became the second head of the Jerusalem church. The Epistle is dated around AD 44-49 making it the oldest written book in the New Testament canon.

James writes of patience and wisdom and the permanence of God and God's Word. He also cautions about the power of the human tongue. But most importantly, throughout the Epistle James writes about faith. As we dwell with James, we come to learn about a faith that works and praying in faith that surrounds all that we are and do as followers of our Lord Jesus Christ.

SPIRITUAL DIRECTION OPPORTUNITY

Spiritual Direction is a ministry of directing thoughts and movements of

our hearts toward God and responding to the presence of God in our lives. It is a conversation among three persons: the Director/Guide; the Directee; and the Holy Spirit which occurs on Holy Ground. The Director/Guide helps another person hear, see, and respond to God.

A Director/Guide offers companionship to help make sense of the faith journey by guidance in interpreting the significant markers on the journey and supporting transitions of the pilgrimage. Together, we foster development of your inner life through prayer. In maturing presence and sacred listening, we will have the opportunity to explore your sacred journey and relationship with God.

Your decision to meet is the result of your desire to examine your spiritual life. My role is not to be a psychotherapist, but it is at times appropriate for us to discuss psychological and relational difficulties in the context of spiritual direction. I do not give advice, but assist in providing direction for personal decision making.

Our meetings are strictly confidential and would occur for approximately one hour a month at a mutually agreeable time. You can end direction at any time. There is no charge for Spiritual Direction.

If you are interested, I would be happy to speak with you and provide more specific information about Spiritual Direction. In confidence, you can contact me through the church office (503-843-4747 or sheridantlc.org) or we can talk before or after Divine Service on a Sunday. As of mid-April, I am a Certified Spiritual Director through Shalom Prayer Center in Mt. Angel, Oregon.

WOMEN AND THE REFORMATION RETREAT MAY 24-25 MOUNT ANGEL ABBEY, ST. BENEDICT, OREGON



WOMEN AND THE REFORMATION

As the 500th anniversary of the Reformation is observed this year, the Columbia River Chapter of the Society of the Holy Trinity is pleased to sponsor a unique overnight retreat on May 24-25, beginning at 1:00 PM Wednesday, May 24, and concluding after lunch on Thursday, May 25, at Mount Angel Abbey focusing on "Women and the Reformation." The retreat will be held at the abbey Guesthouse

Teaching theologian for this event is noted author and professor The Rev. Dr. Kirsi Stjerna of Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary in Berkeley, California. She will deliver two lectures: "Luther and Women" and "The Faith Mothers We Never Knew: Discovering Woman as Leaders of the Reformation:"

In addition to Dr. Stjerna's presentations we will also

- Share in the prayer offices and Holy Eucharist during the time we are together.
- There will be time for **fellowship and reflection** on the grounds of the abbey.
- You will hear a report on OSU campus Pastor Jim Norlie's experience as LWF Fraternal Delegate to the Vatican's Congress on Pastoral Care for International Students.
- Pastor and artist Joel Nickel will share his presentation "Visualizing the Ascension."

You will have access to the excellent abbey library

REGISTRATION

Your \$125 registration fee includes meals (dinner Tuesday, breakfast and lunch on Wednesday) and overnight accommodations in the Abbey Guesthouse along with the program. However, **Accommodations are limited** so register as soon as you can. Registration for meals and program only without overnight accommodations is \$85. The registration fee covers travel and honorarium for our teaching theologian and the amount charged by the abbey guesthouse. Though the Society of the Holy Trinity is a ministerium of ordained Lutheran clergy, everyone is welcome at chapter retreats.

ABOUT OUR TEACHING THEOLOGIAN

Rev. Dr. Kirsi Stjerna is Professor of Lutheran History and Theology at Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary in Berkeley, Dr. Stjerna is the author of many books and articles in her field, including the 2008 book *Women and the Reformation* in which she gathers historical materials and personal accounts to provide a comprehensive and accessible look at the status and contributions of women as leaders in the 16th century Protestant world. She is ordained in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America and the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Finland.

FROM THE HYMNAL

I LOVE TO TELL THE STORY Katherine Hankey, 1834-1911

The celebration of Easter is behind us but the message lives on and should be the focus of our continuing discipleship. Soul-winning is not sales-

manship but simply sharing the message with others who we come in contact with in our daily lives. Sharing our personal faith should be a joyful and satisfying experience as it was with A. Katherine Hankey, author of this hymn text. Born into the home of a wealthy English banker and a member of the Anglican church, Kate early in life developed a passion for evangelical pursuits. She began organizing Sunday school classes for rich and poor throughout London. These classes had a strong influence in the city and many youths subject to them became zealous Christian workers.

When Kate was only 30 years old, she developed a serious illness and during the long period of recovery, she wrote a lengthy poem about the life of Christ. The poem consisted of two main sections, each containing 50 verses. The first section of the poem titled "The Story Wanted" was later adapted for another familiar hymn, "Tell Me the Old, Old Story," and is still widely sung today. Later that same year while yet recovering from her illness, Kate completed the second part of her poem titled "The Story Told," which became the basic part of "I Love to Tell the Story."

It was William G. Fischer (1835-1912) who later put music to the poem that is the familiar tune we know and sing today.



Chicken Spinach Lasagna

- $\frac{1}{2}$ of a 16oz. package lasagna noodles (6-8 noodles)
- 1 carton (32oz) ricotta cheese (can also substitute cottage cheese)
- 1 large can (22.6 oz.) cream of chicken soup
- 8 oz. fresh spinach, chopped
- 4 c. mozzarella cheese
- 2 3 frozen chicken breasts
- 2 T. fresh snipped basil (can use dried; I also use a couple tsp. Italian seasoning)
- 6 plum tomatoes, sliced (can use dried tomatoes)
- ½ c. parmesan cheese, grated



Meanwhile combine soup, ricotta cheese, basil; Stir in juices from chicken. Slice chicken and other vegetables.

Layer ½ noodles in a 9x13 baking dish. Top with half each of chicken, spinach, soup mixture, tomatoes and mozzarella cheese. Repeat layering. Sprinkle with parmesan cheese.

Can refrigerate at this point or bake at 350° for about 45 minutes. Increase baking time about 15 minutes if it has been refrigerated.
